THE EPISTLE FOR THE 29TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



How magnified are Thy works, O Lord; in wisdom hast Thou made them all.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Colossians (3:4-11)

Brethren, when Christ, Who is our life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these, the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience. In these you once walked, when you lived in them. But now put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its Creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all.

THE SYNAXARION

On January 16 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we celebrate the veneration of the precious chains of the **holy and glorious** Apostle Peter.

As Peter sat in prison shackled by the lawless Herod, an angel appeared to him: "Suddenly the angel of the Lord stood by him and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and awakened him, saying: 'Get up quickly.' The chains fell from his wrists" (Acts 12:7). The chains were preserved by Christians as much for the memory of this great

Apostle as well as for their healing power, for many of the sick were healed by touching them as well as with the towel of the Apostle Paul, "then when the face cloths or aprons that touched his skin were applied to the sick, their diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them" (Acts 19:12). Juvenal, the Patriarch of Jerusalem gave these chains as a gift to the Empress Eudocia, the exiled wife of the Emperor Theodosius the Younger. She divided them into two and sent one half to the Church of the Holy Apostle in Constantinople and the other half to her daughter Empress Eudoxia in Rome, the wife of Valentian. Eudoxia built the Church of St. Peter and deposited these chains in it, together with those chains with which Peter was shackled before his death under Emperor Nero.

On this day, we also commemorate **Peusippos and Neonilla, and the martyrs of Cappadocia;** and **Hieromartyr Damaskinos of Hilandar monastery on Athos**. By the intercessions of Thy Saints, O God, have mercy upon us. Amen



THE THEOPHANY AND THE BLESSING OF OUR HOMES

On January 6th, we celebrated the services for the Great Feast of Theophany (الغطاس), in which we commemorate the Baptism of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We also prayed the service of the "Great Sanctification of Water", which marks the beginning of the house blessing season. Traditionally, the blessed waters are used to sanctify the homes of all the faithful. In bringing the blessed water to the homes, and sprinkling it in each room, we rid our house of any evil influence, and re-dedicate it to God in a special way. As we were once renewed by the waters of our own baptism into Christ, so too our home, and our entire lives, are re-dedicated and renewed unto Christ our God each year at this time.

Due the current COVID-19 *Omicron* surge, the blessing of the homes will take place in the following manner:

- 1. The **house blessing form** MUST be filled out and submitted (either online or physically see next page).
- 2. A follow-up call will take place from the Church Office to confirm the appointment.
- 3. Fr. Joseph will contact you before arriving to your home (at least 15 minutes prior to arrival). He will call you once more when he is in front of the house.

Traditionally, it has been a common practice of handing the priest an honorarium (and not GRATUITY) for the service rendered. This has lead to the misconception that if one cannot give the priest an honorarium, it is better to not to have the priest over to come and bless one's home. As mentioned above, it is a misconception and it should be clarified: there is no "fee" attached to the blessing of one's home! It is the priest's DUTY, and therefore he must attend to his flock's needs -in this case, the need of having one's home blessed. The official Clergy Manual of the Antiochian Archdiocese of North America states the following under Section II: The Duties and Responsibilities of the Clergy / D. Duties Specific to Pastors: #4: The pastor MUST SEE that the home of EACH PARISHIONER is visited and blessed each year during the days following Epiphany or other Major Feast Days where the weather conditions are permissible. Therefore, please, let nothing stand in between the priest and the fulfillment of his priestly duty of blessing your home.

We thank you for your understanding regarding these protocols. They have been put into place out of concern for the well-being of our Cathedral Family. The last thing Fr. Joseph would want is to realize that one of his pastoral visits brought about an exposure (COVID-19) to a family rather than a Blessing.

May you all have a blessed Theophany season!

A Blessed and Merry Christmas to you and your families! The purpose of this letter is to inform you that 2022 Annual General Assembly Meeting for the voting membership of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Cathedral will be held on Sunday, January 23, 2022, in person in the Cathedral Hall, immediately following the Divine Liturgy. Please see the agenda enclosed with this letter.

To be recognized as a voting member of Saint George Cathedral, a parishioner must be at least eighteen years of age and have met both the necessary spiritual obligations (as determined by the Pastor) and financial obligations (as determined by the Financial Secretary and your signed 2021 Stewardship/Membership Form). If you have not already done so, please register as a member using the 2021 Stewardship/Membership Form and complete your financial obligation before December 31, 2021. You can also register online by visiting our website and under "Quick Links", click on the "become a member" button. It will take no longer than five minutes! If you have any financial circumstances that prevent you from fulfilling your pledge but would still like to participate, please see the Pastor so that you can discuss these circumstances in a confidential and discrete manner. If you have any questions regarding these requirements, please contact a member of the Cathedral Council.

The goal of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Cathedral is to have all eligible members vote.

As prescribed by the Saint George Cathedral Constitution, during the Annual Meeting, four members will be elected to the Cathedral Council for a term of three years. A Nominating Committee has been appointed to compile a list of qualified candidates. The members of the committee are Fr. Joseph, Mr. Yamil Zacur (Nominating Committee Chairman), Mrs. Andrea M. Abu-Akel (Council Chairlady) and Mrs. Hannan Mounayyer (Council Member). If you or someone you know is interested in running for Council membership and is willing to make the commitment required to fulfill this important obligation, please see enclosed required form and contact Mr. Yamil Zacur, Chairman of the Nominating Committee.

It is important to note that pursuant to the Saint George Cathedral Constitution, no nominations will be accepted from the floor during the Annual General Assembly Meeting. <u>All candidates' names must be submitted to the Nominating Committee by Friday, January 14, 2022, in order for the candidate's name to be included on the Ballot. There can be no exception to this rule.</u>

During this meeting, all members will receive a full 2021 Financial Report, the proposed 2022 Annual Budget, and reports from the various organizations and hear about all current plans for the future.

The Church is our spiritual home. Your involvement in the affairs of your Church is very important. May God bless you all as we prepare for the birth of the Savior!
