

Blessed are Thou, O Lord, the God of our Fathers. For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done to us.

The Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to St. Titus (3:8-15)

Titus, my son, faithful is the saying, and concerning these things I desire you to affirm confidently, that those who have believed in God may be thoughtful of how to preside in honorable occupations. These things are good and profitable to men. But avoid foolish disputes, and genealogies, and contentions, and controversies about the Law; for they are unprofitable and vain. A man who is a heretic after the first and second admonition reject, knowing that such a one is subverted, and sins, being self-condemned. When I send Artemas to you, or Tychicós, give diligence to come to me to Nicopolis; for I have determined to winter there. Set forward Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their journey diligently, that they may be lacking in nothing. And let our people also learn how to preside in honorable occupations, so as to help in cases of urgent need, that they should not be unfruitful. All who are with me salute you. Salute those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke (8:5-15)

The Lord spoke this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell along the path, and was trodden under foot, and the birds of the air devoured it. And some fell on the rock; and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some fell into good soil and grew, and yielded a hundredfold." And when His Disciples asked Him what this parable meant, Jesus said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God; but for others they are in parables, so that seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy; but these have no root, they believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way, they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As Jesus said this, He called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

THE SYNAXARION

On October 16 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate **Longinus the Centurion**.

Saint Longinus came from Cappadocia and lived during the reign of Emperor Tiberius. He was the head of the detachment of soldiers to which Pontius Pilate assigned the crucifixion of the Lord as well as the sealing and guarding of the tomb of Jesus Christ. As they witnessed the miracles that took place at the time of the crucifixion, Saint Longinus believed in Christ and uttered the phrase written down in the Holy Gospel: "Surely he was the Son of God!" (Matthew 27, 54).

He immediately gave up everything and along with two soldiers fled to his homeland, Cappadocia, where he was dedicated to preaching the miracle of the Resurrection of the Lord. This act was denounced by the Jews to Pontius Pilate, who denounced the defection of Longinus and the two soldiers to Tiberius.

Then, by order of the emperor, his envoys went and found Saint Longinus and the two soldiers who followed him. They were preaching the Gospel of the Resurrection. Before being decapitated, he informed Saint Longinus of the decision of Emperor Tiberius. Being overwhelmed by the grace and blessing of the Resurrection of Christ, Saint Longinus hosted the detachment and prepared his tomb. So did the two loyal soldiers of Saint Longinus. The emperor's envoys decapitated the martyrs the following day. Those who endure with dignity to the end the temptations and the disdain of this world remain peaceful and happy, always devoted to the Crucified and Resurrected Jesus Christ.

The Mystery of Repentance: Every Christian feels a natural yearning of the heart towards God, a true desire to taste the sweetness of communion with Him as He created us to be. This longing for inner peace can be fulfilled as we participate in the spiritual life within the Orthodox Church. In particular, the Mystery of Repentance (Holy Confession) restores us to a blessed union with the Living God.

Beloved Hierarchs, reverend Clergy, and Christ-loving Faithful of our Archdiocese,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

October is Youth Month in our archdiocese, a time to focus on the place of young people in the Church. Throughout this month, we ask them to read the epistle and pass the collection tray, but this is not the extent of their service to God. These visible roles are just a symbol of the fact that we consider them, even at this young age, to be true partners within the Body of Christ. We recognize that each of them is called to contribute his or her work to our common life and ministry. We need them to serve in many ways now and to prepare for even greater service in the future.

To our youth I say this: Boldly and courageously follow Christ. As St. Paul says, "Let no one despise your young age, but be an example for the believers in word, in behavior, in love, in faith, and in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12). Out of love for Christ, turn away from the empty distractions of worldly life and follow the hard path of virtue. Dedicate your lives to God as a sacrifice, a holy gift of love that pleases Him. Serve God, the Church, and humanity with all the energy and idealism of your age. Your growth in virtue, in service, and in devotion to Christ will bring us the greatest joy.

October is also Seminary Month, a reminder of our seminaries' and theological institutions' critical role in preparing the next generation of priests, deacons, youth workers, chanters, iconographers, chaplains, and teachers. Since this year has been dedicated to the theme of vocations, I ask our young people to prayerfully discern whether they are being called to one of these particular ministries. We especially need faithful young men, full of love and zeal, to consider a calling to the priesthood. I encourage our youth to talk to their bishops, priests, youth workers, and parents to seek help in discovering and following their vocations in the Church. And I ask our adults to do everything they can to support them in following these callings from God.

Finally, in light of Seminary Month, we ask all our parishes to take a special collection in support of our seminaries and theological institutions. Please give generously to support these schools in their essential mission. May the Lord bless all our efforts to train future clergy and church workers.
