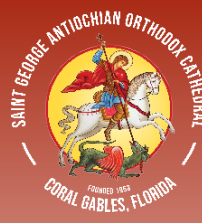

From the heights Thou didst descend, O compassionate One, and Thou didst submit to the three-day burial, that Thou might deliver us from passion; Thou art our life and our Resurrection, O Lord, glory to Thee.

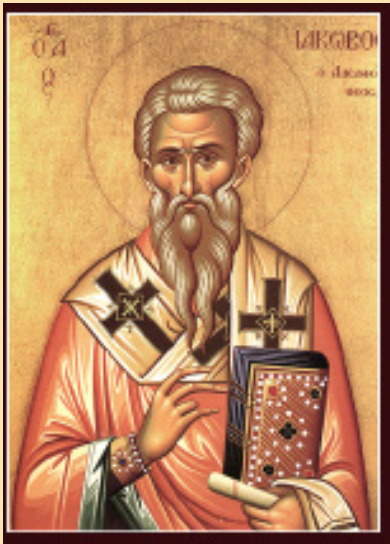
The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke (7:11-16)

At that time, Jesus went to a city called Nain, and many of His disciples and a great crowd went with Him. As He drew near to the gate of the city, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a large crowd from the city was with her. And when the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." And He came and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And Jesus said, "Young man, I say to you: arise." And the dead man sat up, and began to speak. And Jesus gave him to his mother. Fear seized them all; and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and "God has visited His people!"

THE SYNAXARION



On October 9 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate **James the Apostle, son of Alphaeus.**

Holy Apostle James the son of Alphaeus one of the Twelve Apostles, was the brother of the holy Evangelist Matthew. He heard the Lord's words and witnessed His miracles. After the Descent of the Holy Spirit, the Apostle James Alphaeus and the Apostle Andrew the First-Called (November 30), made missionary journeys preaching in Judea, Edessa, Gaza, Eleutheropolis, proclaiming the Gospel, healing all sorts of sickness

and disease, and converting many to the path of salvation. St James finished his apostolic work in the Egyptian city of Ostrachina, where he was crucified by the pagans.

The Mystery of Repentance: Every Christian feels a natural yearning of the heart towards God, a true desire to taste the sweetness of communion with Him as He created us to be. This longing for inner peace can be fulfilled as we participate in the spiritual life within the Orthodox Church.

In particular, the Mystery of Repentance (Holy Confession) restores us to a blessed union with the Living God.

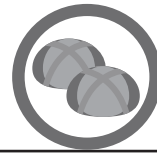

Beloved in Christ, Fr. Paul and esteemed Members of the Parish Council,

Greetings and blessings to you in the name of our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ!

We are very glad to hear that you and your incoming dean, the Very Reverend Father Ayman Kfouf, have already met and begun to get acquainted. He will be an excellent pastor and spiritual leader for your community, bringing a humble and godly spirit along with strong and successful experience in parish ministry.

For practical reasons, we at the archdiocese have asked Fr. Ayman to postpone his start date in this new ministry to July 1, 2023. As you might imagine, we must weigh many different needs and considerations when scheduling the transfer of priests. Summer is the usual time for these transfers, and a January start date will cause hardship for all the priests involved, including Fr. Ayman's successor in Sylvania, Ohio. We are able to proceed with this change as a result of the excellent interim pastoral care being provided by Fr. Paul and his willingness to remain in this interim role until July 1. Therefore, we inform you that the effective date of Fr. Ayman's appointment as dean of your cathedral will now be July 1, 2023. Furthermore, Fr. Paul will remain as your interim dean until July 1; many thanks to Fr. Paul for this service!

As you might have heard, Rev. Fr. Gregory (Gustavo) Alfonso had kindly agreed to serve as interim dean in November and December. However, since Fr. Paul is now settled into this role and is available until July 1, we have released Fr. Gregory from this commitment. We are grateful to Fr. Gregory for his willingness to fill the gap, and we also thank you and Fr. Ayman for your flexibility as plans have changed. Please be assured that the new July 1 start date for Fr. Ayman is final; this will give you confidence to make plans.

Beloved Hierarchs, reverend Clergy, and Christ-loving Faithful of our Archdiocese,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

October is Youth Month in our archdiocese, a time to focus on the place of young people in the Church. Throughout this month, we ask them to read the epistle and pass the collection tray, but this is not the extent of their service to God. These visible roles are just a symbol of the fact that we consider them, even at this young age, to be true partners within the Body of Christ. We recognize that each of them is called to contribute his or her work to our common life and ministry. We need them to serve in many ways now and to prepare for even greater service in the future.

To our youth I say this: Boldly and courageously follow Christ. As St. Paul says, “Let no one despise your young age, but be an example for the believers in word, in behavior, in love, in faith, and in purity” (1 Timothy 4:12). Out of love for Christ, turn away from the empty distractions of worldly life and follow the hard path of virtue. Dedicate your lives to God as a sacrifice, a holy gift of love that pleases Him. Serve God, the Church, and humanity with all the energy and idealism of your age. Your growth in virtue, in service, and in devotion to Christ will bring us the greatest joy.

October is also Seminary Month, a reminder of our seminaries’ and theological institutions’ critical role in preparing the next generation of priests, deacons, youth workers, chanters, iconographers, chaplains, and teachers. Since this year has been dedicated to the theme of vocations, I ask our young people to prayerfully discern whether they are being called to one of these particular ministries. We especially need faithful young men, full of love and zeal, to consider a calling to the priesthood. I encourage our youth to talk to their bishops, priests, youth workers, and parents to seek help in discovering and following their vocations in the Church. And I ask our adults to do everything they can to support them in following these callings from God.

Finally, in light of Seminary Month, we ask all our parishes to take a special collection in support of our seminaries and theological institutions. Please give generously to support these schools in their essential mission. May the Lord bless all our efforts to train future clergy and church workers.

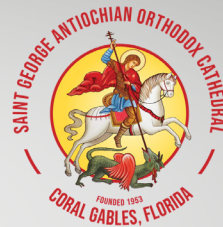

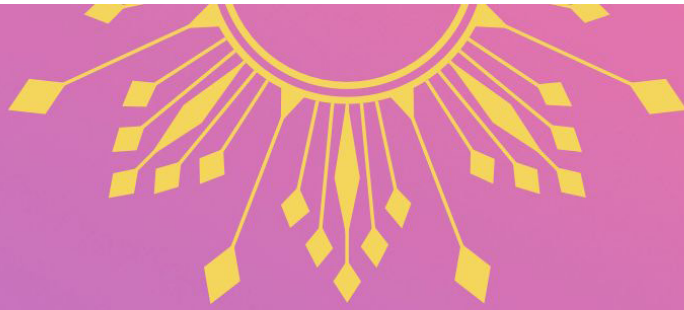




Teen SOYO Pilgrimage
